January is National Mentoring Month

Research confirms that quality mentoring relationships have powerful positive effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic. and professional situations. Ultimately, mentoring connects a young person to personal growth and development, and social and economic opportunity. Yet one in three young people will grow up without a mentor.



Youth who meet regularly with a mentor are:

- 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs and 27% less likely to start drini
 - drugs and 27% less likely to start drinking. (Public/Private Ventures study of Big Brothers Big Sisters)
- 52% less likely than their peers to skip a day of school and 37% less likely to skip a class. (Public/Private Ventures study of Big Brothers Big Sisters)
- In addition to better school attendance and a better chance of going on to higher education, mentored youth maintain better attitudes toward school. (<u>The Role of Risk, 2013</u>)

In the longer term, Young Adults Who Were At-Risk for Falling Off Track But Had a Mentor are:

- 55% more likely to enroll in college
- 78% more likely to volunteer regularly
- 130% more likely to hold leadership positions

How to Get Involved:

- January 4, 2018 –I Am a Mentor Day– A day for volunteer mentors to celebrate their role and reflect on the ways mentees have enhanced their world.
- January 15, 2018 –Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service– A day to share in the inspirational words of MLK, Jr. and elevate the spirit of service through volunteerism.
- January 25, 2018 –#ThankYourMentorDay A day for all who have real life mentoring experiences to thank those who helped them on their path to adulthood and beyond.

January's book discussion is Sunday, January 28th at 7:00 pm to discuss Pawn of Prophecy by David Eddings.


